These overarching goals help us align a wide set of curriculum and skills to enable our students to be more prepared for life after AchieveKids. This umbrella enables our team of professionals, including teachers, behavior analysists, mental health therapists, and speech/language therapists to effectively problem solve and align goals, which focuses our approach to meet individual student needs. At AchieveKids we call this skill development.
